The Burlington Food & Fuel Bank is an **emergency** bank for Burlington Residents through the Social Service Office which is also a referral agency.

The application along with proof of address, identity and all required paperwork must be presented to become eligible. The information you furnish will be kept strictly confidential. If there are any changes, such as income, number of dependents, address, phone number, etc., you must notify the Social Service Office at the number listed above.

For Heating Assistance, you must contact the Human Resource Agency of New Britain (HRA) located in Bristol, CT at 860-584-2725 and apply for the Energy Assistance Program. You must have at least had an appointment with HRA before you can become eligible for heating assistance with the Town. When approved or not approved you must notify the town social services office. If you are accepted into the town program, the heating season is defined as October through March. If you are denied by HRA you may still be eligible for the Town's assistance.

DOCUMENTS NEEDED TO APPLY FOR THE FOOD PANTRY

- 1. Proof of Burlington Residency**
- 2. Proof of identity:** for all adult household members – ONE of the following:
 - a. Driver's License
 - b. Non-Driver's License
 - c. Birth Certificate

DOCUMENTS NEEDED TO APPLY FOR THE FUEL BANK

In addition to the above required documents, the fuel bank requires copies of your (and Significant Other's) last two (2) paystubs (or Social Security, Disability, Unemployment), all active bank statements both savings and checking, copies of retirement savings/investments, latest Income Tax Return and any other source of income or savings.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: Keep this sheet for future references

HOURS: The food pantry will be open from 9:30 AM to 11 AM every other Tuesday, which coincides with the Mobile Food Share Truck.

Visits to the food pantry: Each family may access the pantry no more than once every two weeks unless other arrangements are made.

Burlington Mobile Foodshare Pantry: The Mobile Foodshare Truck is in Burlington (parking lot near the tennis courts) every other Tuesday from 11:15 AM to 11:45 AM. Residents are welcome to pick up all items available on the truck. Volunteers are available to assist you.
